



Introduction

Girls Time Club (GTC) is an arm of Zion City Foundation a registered organization focused on empowering young people especially girls through mentorship in a free, comfortable and safe environment which we call a "Safe space". Currently there are 2 clubs comprising of 15 girls each that are aged between 12-18 years with so much demand from the community as more girls are in the waiting list wishing to join.

To balance up Zion City Foundation also has a boys club comprising of 10 boys aimed at fostering gender equality through girl empowerment which is still in its infancy stage and developing well with mentor Frank leading it. Girls Time club was formed in 2015 and has since had great impact in the community as witnessed in the stories to be shared below. This club's main focus is on helping girls develop critical thinking, problem solving skills.

The club encourages creative thinking and decision making skills. Psychosocial support is also offered by mentors Procedure and Mercy who are passionate about girl empowerment. In the club, skills like baking and sewing are also taught. 2022 was a good year as progressive development was witnessed in the club one of which being involved in a short film entitled "Mentorship, a pathway out of poverty".

The film showed the impact of mentorship in the life of a young girl who had experienced challenges with an uneducated mother after the death of the father who was the family breadwinner. Through mentorship she broke the cycle of poverty and also became a change agent in her community. This filming activity saw two of the club members taking centre stage.

Moreover, a Library that has internet and a few technological devices was put up. This year we managed to take the members on out door activities such as veiwing of the Zambezi River, partaking in sporting activities, and also held commemorations of special days like Menstrual Hygiene Day and International Day of girl.

The aforementioned activities have proven to be critically significant in the development of the girls and boys of the club and we appreciate the milestone of affording these members such.

Some of the challenges we faced this year include the great demand from the community to enroll girls and boys into the two clubs but we could only take a specific number because of lack of resources needed .We kept many on the long waiting list with hope that they might get recruited in 2023.Your donation can allow us to give girls the platform to be heard and seen.

We also experienced some challenges with many girls not attending some lessons at school because of inability to pay fees by parents/guardians .This affected performance at the end of term/year

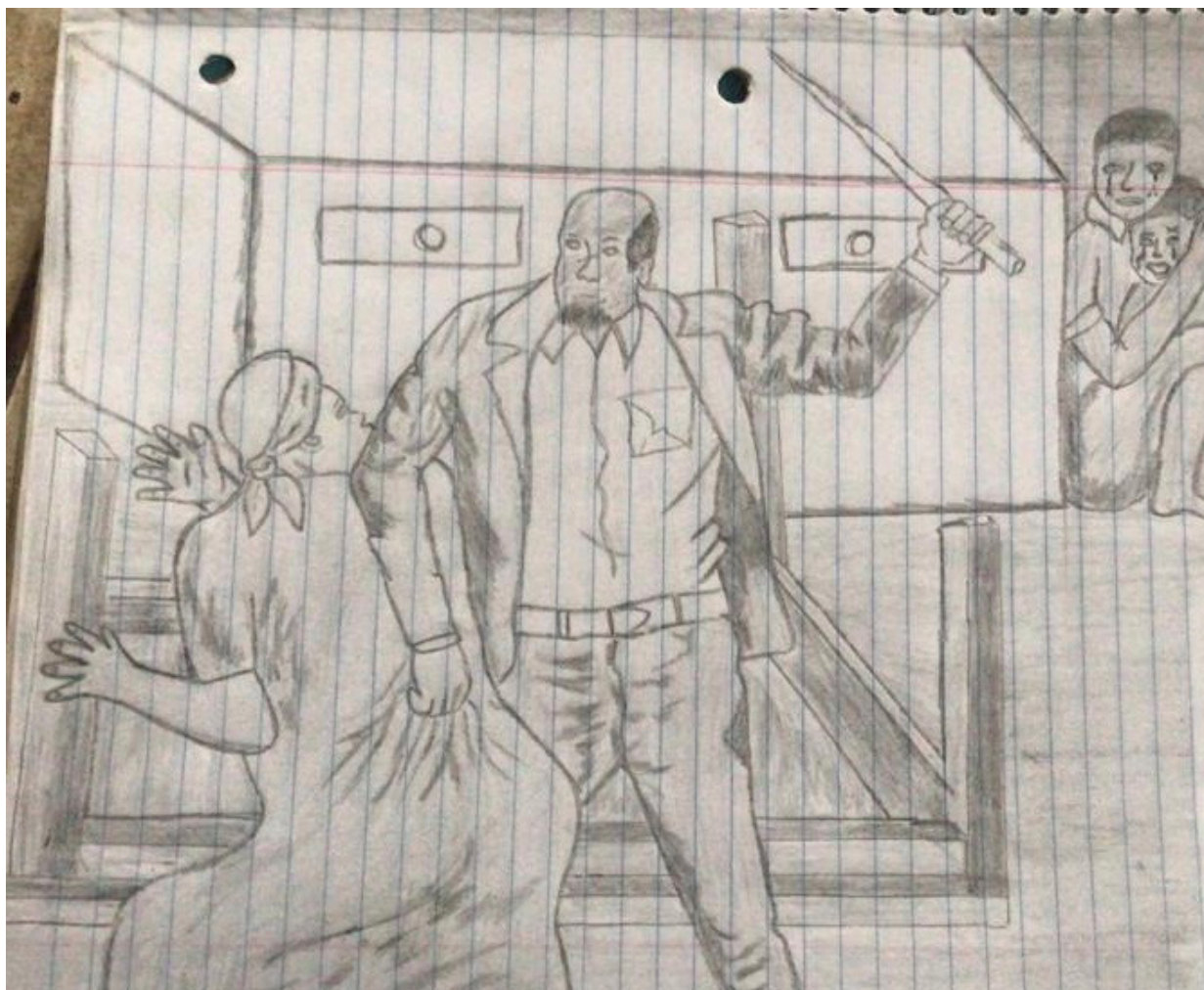
Education is defined as a process whereby a person acquires knowledge and skills.Long ago people had a backward way of thinking.They believed the duty of a girl child was only to be baby making

GTC has changed my life in a very good way. It has influenced my way of thinking, behaving and attitude. At GTC I was taught menstrual hygiene. When I first experienced menstruation I thought that I was now different from everyone. The thought that I should ask my brother money to buy pads made me feel awkward and out of place and the way it's viewed at home did not make the situation an easy. I thought that menstruation was something bad and viewed it as a sickness. GTC taught me that it's normal and every girl out there goes through menstruation. I never thought that we would even celebrate Menstrual Hygiene day but here at GTC we do celebrate it every year on the 28th of May.

This club changed the way I see myself as a girl. I used to be very timid in front of people and start stammering when I try to speak but activities at the safe space have encouraged me to trust myself more. Since I joined the club I am now a confident girl.

A girl who has self esteem. My mentors taught me that the most important thing a girl wears is her confidence. Our mentors at the club encourage to learn a skill of which I am learning how to bake. Every holiday I make sure that I bake something and sell to people through this skill I can earn a living.

I am now a girl who believes in herself and can fight for my rights, thanks to girls time club that taught me that I as a girl can fit in the frame and be a part of the game because my confidence, self esteem and courage is much greater than my fear

At GTC I was taught to stand up for myself and fight for my rights. I'm encouraged to work hard in my studies and there is great improvement in my school work since I joined this club. GTC encourages me to work on what I want to be in life and constantly sharpens my vision showing me that my goals are achievable.

I interviewed Lizzybirth (a member of GTC) and she has this to say "GTC changed my life by giving me sisters. Now I can share my problems

with girls and mentors in the club rather than sitting in a corner crying and stressing myself which used to affect me very much. Now I know I am special and I feel more confident". Some parents that I spoke to, also extended their gratitude for the club which they say helps girls in the community such that they are getting more experience about life and skills such as baking and sewing which help them to never depend on someone and to make decisions for themselves.

A GTC alumni Ratidzai Matumbura is an inspiration to all of us in the club. She excelled in her studies as the mentors supported her to be an excellent student and due to this she excelled exceptionally leading her to getting a scholarship to study business in India. To us this was proof that it can be done. The club through skills training and discussions e.t.c opens opportunities and gives us exposure to what is happening around us and how to be globally competent girls. I and my community are grateful and wish more girls can have the opportunity to be in GTC.

It is my wish that many girls/boys enroll into such clubs so that they also benefit like I did.



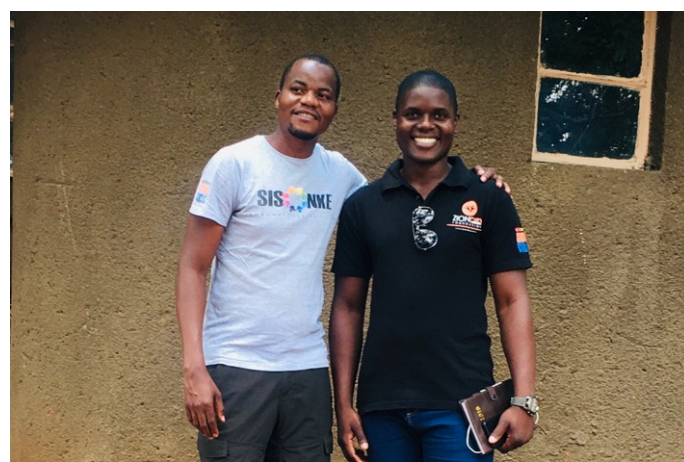
